Our impact at schools

As part of an anonymous evaluation, 59 students aged 10-16 shared their feedback on the ICHTHYS Outreach program. The survey results show that 78% of these young participants value the scientific research conducted by the ICHTHYS project and 67% report that they are rethinking their daily habits to reduce food waste and spoilage in the future.
